

REFLECTIONS FROM THE RABBI

In 1996, when I first entertained the idea of going to rabbinical school, I was very aware that my previous Jewish educational efforts had ended 20 years earlier when I became a Bat Mitzvah. I remember going to various Jewish events-religious and otherwise-and worrying that I wouldn't fit in because I never got the secret decoder ring. But even though I didn't have a Jewish camp experience, or a recent history of Jewish engagement, I found that just being in a Jewish environment was compelling enough to overcome my fears. My reeducation began at that point: relearning the Hebrew alphabet, learning about many traditions and practices for the first time, and discovering the potential of an engaged Jewish life.

I have come to understand that it is not uncommon for Jews to feel as if they are missing some essential part of the Jewish prerequisites. Perhaps you grew up in a completely secular home, or one parent is not Jewish, or your spouse is not Jewish. Or maybe you discovered Judaism as an adult and chose to go through the process of conversion, or maybe you simply compare yourself to someone else who *seems* so much more Jewish than you are.

This kind of insecurity can come from a belief that there is only one "authentic" way to be Jewish, or from a feeling that if you don't learn about Judaism as a child, you can't catch up. That's why, this fall I'll be starting a series of adult learning sessions called "Judaism 101." These will be both stand-alone classes and a series that will address some of the basics of Jewish tradition and practice. The classes will be geared to those who want to brush-up on their knowledge or start fresh. They will be appropriate for those in your family who are Jewish, but also provide helpful background for non-Jewish partners. Please look for a full schedule in the September bulletin. Together, we can create our secret decoder rings!

Summer Kosher Grilling Recipe

In case you missed this one last time this is a real keeper...

Grilled Tuna with Lemon Anchovy Butter

Mild-flavored tuna gets an extra helping of flavor with a topping made from tangy lemon juice and zippy anchovy paste.

TIMES

Prep Time: 5 min Ready Time: 5 min

SERVINGS

4 servings

INGREDIENTS

4 tablespoons butter, softened

1/2 teaspoon Roland® anchovy paste

1 teaspoon lemon juice

1 tablespoon fresh parsley, chopped

Salt

Freshly ground black pepper

4 tuna steaks, about 1-inch thick


1 tablespoon cooking oil

Light grill or heat broiler. In small bowl, combine butter, anchovy paste, lemon juice, parsley and a pinch of salt and pepper.

Coat tuna with oil. Sprinkle with 1/2 teaspoon salt and 1/4 teaspoon pepper. Cook tuna for 4 minutes. Turn and cook until done, 3-4 minutes longer for medium rare.

Top with flavored butter.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH



ROASTED EGGPLANT WITH TECHINA & CHILL SAUCE

Eggplant is now "in" in our house. We had kind of forgotten about it. Then a few weeks ago we had eggplant salad at a friend's house and rediscovered this economical, versatile and tasty vegetable. Our favorite way to eat it is roasted with techina and sweet chili sauce.

Prep Time: 5 minutes **Cook Time:** 30 minutes **Total Time:** 35 minutes

Ingredients:

2 whole eggplants 1/2 lemon 1/3 cup extra virgin olive oil Salt

Preparation:

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F

Cut eggplant in half and rub with juice from lemon

Then cut eggplant halves into medium thick wedges. Put some olive oil into the palm of your hand and rub on slices until just lightly coated Sprinkle with salt

Roast the eggplant at 375 degrees F for 20-30 minutes or until browned on top and cooked through

Serving Suggestion: Serve the eggplant slices warm. Put two small bowls on the table, one with techina and the other with sweet chili sauce. Each person can top their eggplant with the sauce or sauces they like.
