This is arguably our strongest congregational program and we have developed a unique and successful way of providing education for our demographically and geographically diverse community. Please come and check out our new Beit Mirash—communal Hebrew Learning Program—and see what else we've been working on.

We've also started meeting on Wednesday afternoon, from 1-2:30 pm for Torah Study. Like our Saturday gathering, we read and discuss the Torah portion of the week, working together to discover meaning and relevancy. I will be in Jerusalem the first two weeks of January, but we will resume on January 25th. All are welcome!

Finally, we are very fortunate to have Betsy Marateck and Benita Kolmen Solomon step into the role of co-chairs of the Adult Education committee. I know they are working hard on developing a wide range of talks and educational offerings.





Congregation Meeting

Sunday January 22nd



Presidential Address

On a recent road trip, John and I were driving on a frigid sunny day. We were traveling with a friend, who startled me when she said, "Look at how beautiful the moon is!" It was the middle of the day, and I hadn't noticed that the moon was visible.

2016 ends and 2017 begins with lighting Hanukkah candles. Between the Christmas lights on the 24th of Kislev and New Year's fireworks and football on the 3rd of Tevet, we will light one small candle a night. It's been 11 years since the last night of Hanukkah fell on New Year's Day. How can we experience the light from our candles? Is it defiant? Overpowered? A statement of a commitment? I envision our collective candles impossibly shining in this brilliant display of Christian and secular bright lights, like the moon in the daytime.

I have to look for those lights. And in my mind's eye, looking for them means I have to think about what really lights up our Jewish lives and our community. So in keeping with the somewhat startling confluence of our Jewish and secular lives, I offer some Jewish resolutions.

- 1. Let's keep healthy together. Exercise and eating right is all well and good, but finding a balance in our busy lives is an important part of health. So let's come together more often for Shabbat, or Torah study, or hanging out at Sunday school, because this gives us a Jewish breathing space in our week. Rabbi Nina is now offering Torah study on Wednesdays at one as well as Saturday mornings.
- 2. Let's remember that we can always begin again. Every morning and every week we are supposed to remember that creation is constantly being renewed. So we too can resolve to keep on creating our connections to each other.
- 3. Let's find ways to practice Tikkun Olam, the repair of the world, together. Whether your passion is for political activism, environmental causes, hunger, the welfare of children... Think of ways to bring your own way of repairing the world to our community. We have a Tikkun Olam committee, and maybe you should join it! Contact Edye Newman.
- 4. Let's stay financially healthy. Your treasurer and your Board work hard to create a budget that is realistic and to be careful stewards of our resources. But our budget assumes that members participate in the common goal of maintaining a Jewish community. Our dues and donations are what each of us contributes to providing for our shared Jewish home. Our congregational meeting on January 22 is like a family meeting. Please plan on coming.

Hebrew School Report...what we've been doing so far.

Beit Midrash: After our morning service, the entire school gets together for a "house of study" session, ala a one-room school house. Thanks to the enthusiastic leadership of Tom Solomon, the students are learning Hebrew verbs and phrases through movement and interactive exercise. And then in smaller groups, have been working on the "Hebrew letter of the week" with level-appropriate curriculum. This allows the children to learn at their own pace, not that of a class. Another benefit of the Beit Midrash is that our teen group *madrichim* (leaders) are teaching and coaching alongside our main Hebrew teacher, Tom Solomon.

The **Alef Class** is our youngest group and they have learned about Rosh Hashana, Yom Kippur, Sukkot, and Simhat Torah, as well as holiday-relevant Torah stories. Their curriculum this semester includes learning about Israel, and starting to get familiar with the concepts of our most basic prayers.

The **Bet Class** are the ones in the middle, and they also learned about the holidays and Torah stories. They took a special three-session, mini-course on Jewish Customs and Folklore with a guest teacher, Ellen Taylor. They have just begun the Yisrael Sheli (My Israel) curriculum.

Our oldest students in the **Gimmel Class** studied the ethical messages of the High Holy Days and also took the mini-course with Ellen Taylor. They are learning about Israeli cities and regions, and have just started a new class on Jewish values.

New this year is **B'nei Mitzvah Boot Camp**, several sessions of individual study throughout the Hebrew School morning with our older teens and students from Bucknell and Susquehanna University. This has given them extra preparation time, in addition to tutoring with the rabbi. In keeping with our theme of Jewish communities around the world, some of our **crafts** this fall have included a global flair, including a project with grapes, in keeping with a Cuban tradition of eating 12 on the eve of Rosh Hashana, and Greek-style Hanukkah pancakes.

Tracey Peyser, a student from Susquehanna University has been coming in periodically throughout the year to do special mitzvah-focused projects. She and the kids made seasonal decorations that were brought to Grayson Manor, a local senior residence; they've made Thanksgiving magnets to be delivered through Meals-on-Wheels; and even Hanukkah cards.




